### Continuing our 2023-2024 season



Playing Saturday April 6, 2024 at Zion beginning 10:30am.

From Derek Tam: Explore English Romanticism in this upcoming session of part songs, arranged for recorders! Harmonically lush and textually aware, late 19th-century part songs are a relatively neglected portion of the choral repertoire—undeservedly so. We'll dive into selections from Edward Elgar, Charles Villiers Stanford, Arthur Sullivan, and Ralph Vaughan

Williams. These pieces offer many opportunities for negotiating nuances of dynamics and tempo as a group.

If your last name begins with M-Z, please bring a snack for the break, if possible.

We have been requiring at-home Covid testing the day of the playing, and if possible, asking that you bring your NEGATIVE test to the event in a zipped baggie, or a date-stamped photo otherwise. Of course, positive tests STAY HOME, as well as if you have symptoms of *any* illness.
